BY-LAWS COLUMBUS HOME ASSOCIATION OF QUINCY

On May 15, 2017 the following by-laws change will be voted on by the membership. This change was approved by the Directors on April 17, 2017 and they recommend your approval. This meeting will start promptly at 6:30 p.m.

Article V – Meetings

SECTION 1. The members of this corporation shall hold at least four meetings each year, one each quarter. **One to be considered the annual meeting, on the second Tuesday in June of each year, for the election of directors and for such other business as shall come before the Board. One meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in September each year shall be called the budget meeting for consideration and adoption of the budget submitted by the Board of Directors. (To be replaced with the following:) The annual meeting for the election of directors will be held on the third Monday of June and the budget meeting is to be held on the third Monday of September.**

The other quarterly meetings will be held to attend to such business as shall come before the Board. Such meetings may be continued, postponed, or adjourned by a majority vote of the membership present, whether a quorum is present or not.

Perspective from the Pew



Easter Sunday, just a few days ago, I overheard a parishioner say "Church is full, I wonder where all these people came from?" To which another said, "Aw, they are C & E Catholics . . . you know, they come to Mass on Christmas and Easter." By that time I had moved on and could no longer hear their conversation, but it got me to thinking, why?

I knew the celebration of Easter was the principal feast of the ecclesiastical year. It is the greatest feast of all, and in fact, Christmas is celebrated only in preparation for Easter. The New Testament states that the resurrection of Jesus, which Easter celebrates, is the foundation of the Christian faith. It is a symbolic meaning of a new creation of mankind by Jesus risen from the dead. Each Mass we celebrate takes us back to that night of the Passion, reclining at the table, to hear Jesus' words again.

Why would one not want to celebrate that as often as possible?

I try not to be judgmental. So, I searched for and found something I had read sometime in the past. So profound in meaning, that I knew I would not forget these words of Benedict XVI, which takes us to the very heart of the gospel: **"Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives a life a new horizon and a decisive direction."**

Again, I am asking myself, why would one not want to celebrate this as often as possible?

Okay, so there are those who only attend Mass twice a year, and I know Jesus told me not to judge others, which I try not to do as much as possible. I know the Church says in Canon Law, that a Catholic must attend to Reconciliation once a year and also receive Eucharist once a year.

Again, I am asking myself, why would one not want to celebrate this as often as possible?

The final words of Mass: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." I guess the question we need to answer for ourselves is this: are we merely adhering to that which is required of us, or are we listening and leaving Mass to go out and glorifying the Lord?

QUINCY CURSILLO INVITATION

Cursillo was founded to initially help men become the spiritual leaders of their family. What does that Mean? Come and See! Bring your questions to the weekend. Find answers for you personally. Who is my personal Jesus? We ask that you do not judge this movement until you come and give 3 days of your time to Jesus. You will find answers and a peace and joy thru the experience.

Anyone age 21 or older can make a weekend. (TEC – Teens Encounter Christ is for anyone 16-21.)

Men and Women make individual weekends. For married couples, the man makes a Cursillo before the wife. There are 8 weekends per year, 4 for men and 4 for women.

Cost for a weekend is \$150 and there is a financial gift of \$75 available when needed. This covers all meals and your room for the weekend. The weekend is held from 7:30 p.m. Thursday evening until Sunday evening. The location is at QU Franciscan Retreat Center (North Campus).

You do need someone to sponsor you. This is to help you with the application and getting you to the weekend, as well as follow-up with you.

Anyone who has made a Cursillo can be a sponsor.

MOTHER'S DAY POEM
