Perspective from the Pew



A Legacy

What is a Legacy? Some believe it is in a name, and having a child to carry it into the future. Some believe it is having a building named after them, or perhaps it is a sizeable contribution in your name to help others.

Many of us live our day to day lives without thinking much about our impact, who we have influenced, touched, or helped. What is not often realized is this legacy of yours, is being written every day through the interactions you have with others.

At some time in our lives we have discussed those who have passed, often sharing our stories involving the one who has passed, stories of how they lived and how they touched our lives. Throughout our lives, we leave our mark on people during every interaction. Some marks brush against the skin – quickly forgotten – while others penetrate deeper.

The ones that go deep enough to leave a scar are the ones remembered. With a scar comes a story to tell. Some stories are tragic and pain us to retell while others tell of bravery and lessons learned. Whether or not we are leaving a legacy is not the right question to ask ourselves because we **all** are! The right question is whether we are pleased with the legacy we are leaving.

We fail to remember that what we do daily with that one person is how we will be remembered. We have forgotten the words from Saint Matthew:

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'*

Saint Matthew wrote these words to teach us about a Legacy. So long as we remain focused on his words, we will know what needs to be done daily.
