Perspective from the Pew



We all know the commandment, "If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in His love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you." *John 15: 10-12*

There is nothing singular about this commandment. Yes, of course you must love yourself first, and in doing so you can love another. Love is our true destiny. Jesus Christ told us to do this. I am reminded of I Corinthians 13: 1-8:

If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, love is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing.

There is nothing singular about this! We must interact with one another. We must extend to each other the sign of peace. Our relationship with another is precisely what Jesus told us and Saint Paul provides us with the how to do it. We find the meaning of life when we are with them. We learn of their trials and tribulations and we are given, by them, the opportunity to walk with them, beside them, on a great and wonderful journey.

May we take the time to love today, to walk a few more steps with them, and try our best to adhere to Saint Paul's words.
